# 1. Big Picture Contribution

- Exceptional administrative and intelligence data
  - Clever identification strategy (exit-driven vacancy shocks)
  - Important question: prison as recruitment channel into organized crime
  - Sections 7.2–7.4 particularly strong for identification

## 2. Introduction & Framing

- Estimation framework explained too late (p. 28)
  - Suggest preview of IV strategy upfront
  - Quantitative magnitudes should appear in the Introduction
  - Highlight mechanism results (rank, visits, work) earlier

# 3. Literature Review – Focus

- Section 2 is very broad (organized crime generally)
  - Refocus on recruitment and "prison-based human capital formation"
  - Clarify claim of "sizeable evidence" on crackdowns strengthening gangs (one paper in a qualitative journal?)

# 4. Conceptual Framework

## Suggestion

- Consider simple model of prison manager incentives:
  - Minimize Violence(inmate mix, gallery type)
  - Subject to space constraints and risk profiles
  - Rehabilitation likely secondary to short-run security

# 5. Identification & Allocation

- IV based on relative exit-induced vacancy shocks
  - Discuss possibility of strategic reshuffling before entry

## 6. Mechanism or Bundle Effect?

- Gang galleries are larger (125 vs 59 inmates)
  - Younger population, more violent offenders
  - Are we identifying gang governance or gallery composition?
  - Could effects reflect a bundled effect?

# 7. Network Measure (Table 1)

- Monotonicity imperfect (Order 1 vs Order 2)
  - Large share in '999' category
  - Possible misreporting of gang compatibility
  - Consider validation using geography or neighborhood (or a mix of your measure + geography)

# 8. Sample Restrictions

- Focus on 18–25-year-old first-time offenders
  - Clear motivation (vulnerability)
  - But recruitment can occur later
  - Do results generalize to older cohorts?

# 9. Channels & IV Consistency

- Table 11: mechanism analysis
  - Why not use IV for channel regressions?

# 10. Presentation & Minor Points

- Clarify whether figures use 90% or 95% CIs
- Table ordering issue (Table 2 after Table 3)
- Clarify term 'gang-related normal business crime'
- Compatibility recorded only systematically since 2024? But text suggests earlier availability
- '999' terminology unclear – rename?
- Clarify the use of the word "occurrences"
